

Vantage Learning announces alignment with the Common Core Standards

The Common Core State Standards Initiative is a state-led effort coordinated by the National Governors Association Center for Best Practices (NGA Center) and the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO). As of Friday, 34 states, including Washington, have adopted the CCSS. The initiative, developed in collaboration with school administrators and teachers, is expected to provide schools nationwide with a consistent set of standards to measure students' progress in order to prepare them for college and the workplace.
